Klosterman's collaboration with top builders has her specifying materials, fixtures and finishes that bring her design visions to realization. 


Desert Highlands Modern









The modern interiors that AB Design Elements crafted in Fountain Hills are focused on the views. With architecture by Cosan Studio, the home's expansive long-range views dominate the interior, connecting it to the desert. The homeowners, a Canadian couple, wanted to embrace the vistas and create a retreat, an oasis. White oak flooring fills the home with a light and warm ambiance. The fireplace is clad with natural stone and complements the wood millwork to accentuate architectural details. Accentuating the great room and open kitchen, a glass box dining and wine room create visual drama. Warm neutral upholstery mixes with metal and wood furnishings as an expression of modern luxury living.











In Scottsdale, the Pinnacle Canyon home by interior designer Amy Klosterman is a nearly 10,000-square-foot estate with an open plan and expansive outdoor patios. 
A Modern Estate
